Charles Edwin Ashley, a lifelong resident of DeRidder, Louisiana—and a citizen of the world—set sail on his final journey on January 18, 2025, in Lafayette, Louisiana. Born in Leesville, Louisiana, Charles lived a life few could imagine, filled with adventure, discovery, and a boundless curiosity about the world and its people.

A pioneer in deep-sea saturation diving, his career took him to the farthest reaches of the globe, unlocking experiences that shaped his soul and expanded his understanding of life beyond borders. Of all the places he roamed, his heart found its deepest connection to Central and South America. He spent much of his life immersed in cultures far from the beaten path—often living among the Miskito Indians, venturing into untouched jungles, and chronicling his journeys in written reflections that became treasured stories for his family. To his children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, he was not just a father and grandfather—he was "Jungle Pop" - a storyteller, an explorer, and a man who lived life on his own terms.

Charles leaves behind a family who adored him and will carry forward his love for adventure and knowledge.

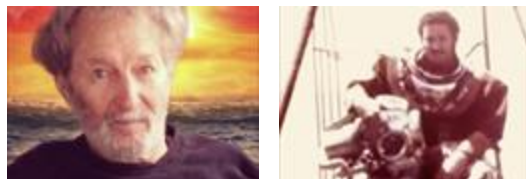
