



## Page Cameron Folsie

A Funeral Service will be held on Saturday, November 5, 2022, at 12:00 pm in Abbeville United Methodist Church in Abbeville for Page Cameron Folsie, age 56, who passed away at Abbeville General Hospital on Friday, October 28, 2022, in Abbeville.

Page was born to Leo and Verda Mae “Jackie” Folsie in Morgan City on April 13, 1966 and he was a lifelong resident of Acadiana. He was a 1984 graduate of Abbeville High School along with Donna Pierce, who he had no clue he would eventually marry. Page began working at a young age as a bag boy, eventually working his way up to store manager at several local grocery stores. Over time, he became more involved with the technology part of managing a store, and really found his passion. Page continued working in this role for many years and actually started his own business where he would build and repair computers. Earlier this year, he took a leap of faith and left the

grocery business to further his career. Page's passion for computers led him to land a position in the IT Department at LHC Group, one of the largest home health companies in the country.

Page and Donna married on June 25, 1994, and two years later welcomed their first child, Pete. Within four years the family grew to four with the birth of their second son, Joel. From the start, Page had a love for music and enjoyed many concerts. He had an encyclopedic knowledge of "his" bands; from Queensryche to Depeche Mode to KISS, he knew every song, who sang it, which members of the band played it, and the name of the new singer who was alright, but not the same. Throughout the years Page enjoyed video games, camping, casinos, and spending time with his family. He was a dedicated husband, father, brother, and friend. Page will be dearly missed.

Page is survived by his wife, Donna Pierce Folsie; his sons, Pete Folsie (Madison) and Joel Folsie; his siblings, Skeets Folsie, Vicki Brannon, Ginger Boudreaux, and Stephanie Dupuis; his brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law; as well as numerous nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Leo and Jackie Folsie.
