Through this outreach, Patrick welcomed questions about the Bible from anyone willing to ask, with the heartfelt goal of sharing God's Word and helping others grow in their faith.

Patrick enjoyed golfing, fishing, gardening, and, as those who loved him will fondly remember, occasionally annoying people just for fun. He had a quick wit, a strong personality, and a gift for making life interesting.

One of Patrick's greatest joys in his later years was his beloved cat, Kitty. Their special bond brought him comfort, companionship, and countless moments of happiness.

Patrick was especially close to his sister, Patricia "Patty" Hymel. Their relationship was marked by an extraordinary bond, countless memories, and unwavering love for one another.
