Sue had a very unique gift of remembering sports statistics and, the ability to recall them at any given time. She would impress her doctors by having them ask her who the pitcher was for The Atlanta Braves, on any given year between 1979-2016, always asking too "the starting pitcher or the relief pitchers"? She would promptly give the correct answer like it was nothing, and laugh as the doctor would check GOOGLE for the answer...and, yes, Sue was right! It wasn't just pitchers though, she could also recall RBI's, ERA's, etc! Before her health declined, she would attend Church services at a few select non-denominational churches in the Acadiana area. Long ago Sue accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior...she loved Jesus with all her heart. Sue, being quiet, reserved with a somewhat shy demeanor, a homebody, always looked forward to church services since this was her opportunity to praise, learn more about Jesus, and, socialize with fellow churchgoers. Besides Sue's favorite pastime of watching sports on TV she also loved to draw, color, and was an avid reader until the disease robbed of her that as well. When it came to her appetite Sue loved to eat her favorite foods which were boiled crawfish, Popeyes, pizza, hamburgers, Okra gumbo, cookies and candy! She loved her soft drinks too...DR. Pepper and PEPSI. Sue loved listening to music, especially pop music and country. She was a big fan of Lauren Daigle as well as the late greats Michael Jackson, and Whitney Houston. Sue loved life, lived it simple and well, loved her family and friends dearly. She was always loving, very generous and giving, and so thoughtful. Sue was known to send greeting

cards for every occasion to those within her circle of family and friends. In turn, Sue was beloved by all and, will forever remain loved in our hearts and mind. We will always be thankful and grateful God blessed our lives with giving us such a jewel...there was no one like Sue.
